Colorado Blue Spruce: Great for landscapes, colors range from slightly blue-green to marvelous blue. Tolerate a wide range of soil conditions, grows to an average height of 80 feet.



Norway Spruce: A wonderful windbreak plant, this dense evergreen has short dark green, flat needles. Will grow in most Ohio soils except water soaked. Reaches an average height of 50-60 feet.



Ohio Buckeye: This is a neatly rounded tree with low, sweeping branches and dense foliage that provides deep shade. The nuts are a small, dark brown nut with a light patch.



Bald Cypress: This unique evergreen loses its needles each year! Grows in a wide range of soil conditions from wet, swampy areas to dry upland areas. Grows 50 to 70 feet in height.



Northern White Cedar: This beautiful evergreen foliage is frond-like on flat branches varying from dark to light green during the growing season. It is also a great windbreak choice, growing in a pyramid-like shape with a height of 18-45 feet.



Tulip Poplar: This large shade tree can grow up to 80' tall and 40' wide. It prefers full sun in deep, rich, moist soil that at times can be wet. This tree is able to get quickly established and grow fast!



River Birch: River Birch prefers moist, deep, rich, acidic soils. Full sun to partial shade. Fast growing. Grows 70' tall by 40' wide for a single trunked tree. 50' tall by 40' wide as a multitrunked tree.



Redbud: A native shrub reaching 20' tall by 20' wide when grown in open space. Prefers deep, moist, organic well-drained soils but adapts well. Full sun is best for rapid growth and flowers.



Sycamore: A grand, stately shade tree, great for a larger site. It has broad green leaves but is most recognizable by its peeling bark, with patches of white and gray. Mature trees can be 75'-100' tall and 50'-70' wide.



Red Oak: Native to the Midwest, it is one of the faster growing oaks for the home landscape. The leaves are handsome throughout the year, becoming bright red in autumn.



Swamp White Oak: Prefers moist to wet, poorly-drained soils, however adapts well to dry and average soils. Beautiful leaves with light undersides, can reach up to 70 feet in height and 60 feet wide.



Green Giant Arborvitae: It has soft foliage and can tolerate drought and most soil conditions. It is also white tail deer resistant. This hybrid can grow 3 feet a year reaching a width of 6-10' and 25' tall.



Red Maple: A red tinge can be found in its flowers, twigs, and seeds, but it is most notable for the scarlet of its leaves in fall. Red maple needs plenty of room for its dense, spreading root system.



Black Cherry: Fast growing, medium sized tree. Flowers are small and white in early spring, followed by small berries in late summer. Dark green leaves turn yellow to red in the fall. Height of 50-60'.

Native Tree Pack Options:

These custom native packs will contain two of each of the trees listed. These packs are a great way to start a healthy wildlife habitat!

Wildlife Tree Pack:

Swamp White Oak, American Hazelnut, Ninebark, American Plum and Red Osier Dogwood.

Pollinator Tree Pack:

Red Osier Dogwood, Choke Cherry, American Plum, Meadowsweet and Pasture Rose.

Wild Berry Tree Pack:

Black Elderberry, Alleghany Serviceberry, Red Currant and Red Mulberry.
